

CPP HEALTH AND SAFETY MEASURES

At CPP, we will continue to follow and update our policies as we receive updated guidance from the Centers for Disease Control (CDC) and Virginia's Department of Social Services (DSS).

Check-In and Pick-Up

- Families are greeted at the door or curb. Parents and other family members are discouraged from entering the building. **By bringing your child to school, you attest that your child and anyone living in your home is COVID symptom free.**

1. Do you live with anyone or have you had close contact with anyone who has been diagnosed with COVID-19 within the past 14 days?
2. Do you or anyone in your household have a fever, cough and/or shortness of breath?
3. Do you or your child have any other signs of communicable illness such as a cold or flu?

- Children and staff are required to wash their hands immediately upon entering the building and frequently throughout the day.

- Upon your arrival to pick up your child, a staff member brings your child out to you. Doing so limits direct contact and helps maintain social distancing.

Healthy Environment

- Equipment used in the program is not shared and is cleaned between uses.
- Staff disinfect high-touch surfaces, such as door handles, light switches, faucets, toilets seats, and handles routinely.
- Toys that cannot be washed are not used.
- Children are not allowed to bring toys from home.

- Resting cots are spaced out as much as possible for those who stay for afternoon rest time.

- Program staff will perform an enhanced deep cleaning every afternoon in all areas.

- Staff have access to hand sanitizers (at least 60% alcohol) and disposable gloves and use them as needed.

- Staff and children wash their hands with soap and water for at least 20 seconds often: upon arrival, before and after eating, after diapering or using the toilet, after playing outdoors, and following any contact with bodily fluid.

- Staff will wear face coverings when they are inside and when a distance of 6ft or more cannot be maintained outside. Children age two or older may wear face coverings.

Food Preparation and Service

- All surfaces are disinfected before snack preparation and lunch time using EPA-approved disinfectant products.

- All staff and children wash hands before and after snack and lunch time.

- Each child will bring his/her lunch from home.

- Children do not share eating utensils.

Child Health

- Staff receive education on COVID-19 symptoms as well as preventive measures to ward off the spread of COVID-19.

- Children who start to experience symptoms of respiratory illness, including a fever of 100.4F or above and symptoms of other infectious illnesses while at CPP are isolated from other children until they can be picked up. Pick up needs to occur within 30 minutes by either a parent or selected guardian. Symptoms include fever of 100.4F or higher, dry cough, shortness of breath, chills, sore throat, and loss of taste or smell.

Staff Health

- Staff receive additional training on infection control and cleaning and disinfection.
- Staff are not allowed to work if they are feeling ill, are experiencing respiratory symptoms, or if someone in their household

has COVID-19 symptoms or screens positive for COVID-19.

- Staff wash their hands immediately upon entering the program and throughout the day.

Communication

- Families must supply CPP with up-to-date emergency contact information for their child.
- CPP staff use multiple methods to communicate updates with parents including email, website, telephone, or social media.

I understand the following:

- During CPP programs, I will NOT be permitted to enter the preschool beyond the designated drop-off and pick-up area.
- **By bringing my child to CPP, I attest that he/she and anyone living in the child's household is free from COVID symptoms and is not positive for COVID.**
- If, during the day, any of the following symptoms appear my child will be separated from the rest of the people. I will be contacted, **and my child MUST be picked up within 30 minutes of being notified.** Symptoms include fever of 100.4 degrees Fahrenheit or higher, dry cough, shortness of breath, chills, sore throat, and loss of taste or smell. Your child will need to be symptom free without any medications for 72 hours and have a doctor's note indicating your child is healthy before returning.
- My child will be required to wash their hands using CDC recommended handwashing procedures throughout the day using warm running water and rubbing with soap for at least 20 seconds.
- I will immediately notify CPP's Director if I become aware of any person with whom my child or I have had contact exhibits any of the symptoms listed above, is advised to self-isolate, quarantine, or has tested positive, or is presumed positive for COVID-19.
- While present at CPP, each day my child will be in contact people who are also at risk of community exposure. I understand that no list of restrictions, guidelines, or practices will remove 100% of the risk of exposure to COVID-19 as the virus can be transmitted by people who are asymptomatic and/or before some people show signs of infection. I understand that I play a crucial role in keeping everyone in the facility safe and reducing the risk of exposure by following the practices outlined herein.

I certify that I have read, understand, and agree to comply with the provisions listed herein by submitting the google form, which acts as my consent and agreement. I acknowledge that failure to act in accordance with the provisions listed herein, or with any other policy or procedure outlined by CPP will result in termination of services. I acknowledge that care for my child will be terminated if it is determined that my actions, or lack of action unnecessarily exposes another employee, child, or their family member to COVID-19.
